









## Scope of COTIF






# Scope of COTIF/ CIM and SMGS






# Pan-european Corridors









#### **Custom borders**

at the external border of the EU means also having customs obligations:

declarations export – transit; declarations transit – transit; declarations transit – import; declarations export – import; health inspections; spot checks of the contents of the cargo





# SMGS

#### **Characteristics**

- Contract of carriage is not consensual, but formal contract
- Obligation to carry
- Oligation to establish tariffs
- Consignment note is regulated in SMGS itself
- Joint an several liability

Follow-up Programme

III. Use a uniform/joint through consignment note

"The aim is to make available a uniform consignment note which can be used in through transport and which is sufficient for modern requirements, in Russian, English and, if possible, German. Various initiatives are already available, from which the most suitable model should be selected. This measure should have top priority and should achieve a result within one year. CIT has already said they should be willing to take on this task."



- Based on the United Nations Layout Key for Trade Documents
- Recognition as
  - 1. customs document
  - 2. letter of credit






# **Single Eurasian Rail Transport law**

- 3. Freedom for higher liability standards


